MARATHON BIKE RIDE TO RAISE FUNDS FOR YOUTH INSEARCH

Stockbroker Daryl Allen has set himself another marathon challenge on wheels this month to raise funds for his favourite charity Youth Insearch.

Last year the Bellevue Hill resident raised \$140,000 by riding for 24 hours non-stop around Centennial Park with donations flowing in from business houses and individuals.

A stockbroker with Bell Potter Securities, Mr Allen's marathon performance covered 520kms. He expects to at least reach this mark again, if not better it.

Mr Allen will commence his latest Centennial Park ride at 5pm on Thursday, October 23.

So far three individuals and two teams have confirmed they will join him on the 24 hour ride, committing between \$5,000 and \$10,000.

"Amazingly, two wheelchair athletes are also participating this year as well as Merrylands resident Chris Kukla, a young man from Youth Insearch who rode 100kms last year and is now determined to go the full distance," he said.

Youth Insearch caters for young people aged between 12 and 18 from different backgrounds and lifestyles who have emotional issues relating to family history, drug and alcohol abuse and other similar issues.

"Youth Insearch provides a support mechanism by providing opportunities and skills for young people so that they can play a more positive role in society," Mr Allen says.
